Abaribe's fate hangs, Tambuwal, Umeh, Kingibe, others join ADC

➔ 12 Reps defect, APC, ADC share spoils, PDP further depletes

Official defections of nine Senators from minority parties to the African Democratic Congress (ADC) at plenary, Thursday, resulted in fireworks among lawmakers over the impropriety or otherwise of section 68 (1b and g) of the 1999 Constitution, against Senator Enyinnaya Abaribe (Abia South).
Senator Abaribe, had in a separate

letter forwarded to the President of the Senate, Godswill Akpabio, joined eight other lawmakers to officially defect to the ADC.
While other defectors like Senators Aminu Waziri Tambuwal (Sokoto South), Binos Yaroe (Adamawa South), Victor Umeh (Anambra Central), Tony Nwoye (Anambra North), Lawal

Adamu (Kaduna Central), Ogoshi Onawu (Nasarawa South), Austin Akobundu (Abia Central) and Ireti Kingibe (FCT), cited divisions in their parties – the People's Democratic Party (PDP) and Labour Party (LP) to justify their action – Abaribe couldn't hang on to any reason for his defection from the All Progressives Grand Alliance

(APGA).
Apparently latching on the lacuna, the Senate leadership took up Abaribe on why the aforementioned section should not be invoked against him and invariably declaring his seat (Abia South) vacant.

Iran's new Supreme Leader, Ayatollah Mojtaba Khamenei, Thursday, vowed to keep up attacks on Gulf Arab countries and use the effective closure of the strategic Strait of Hormuz as leverage against the United States and Israel.

It was his first public statement since being chosen to succeed his father, who was killed in an Israeli strike.

Supreme Leader Ayatollah Mojtaba Khamenei, 56, who Israel suspects was wounded in the opening salvo of the war, has not appeared in public since then.

In the statement read by a state TV news anchor, he vowed to avenge those killed in the war, including in a strike on a school that killed over 165 people.

Amid M/East war, FCCPC moves against price manipulations

The Federal Competition and Consumer Protection Commission (FCCPC) Thursday declared an intensified crackdown on exploitative pricing, deceptive market practices and supply manipulation across multiple sectors of Nigeria's economy.
This, the Commission said, is part of

efforts to safeguard consumers and sustain emerging economic stability.
Blueprint reports that the crisis in the Middle East region has increased the cost of goods and services following the drop in the global supply of fuel and the resultant hike in transport fares across Nigeria.

Speaking at a media briefing at the Presidential Villa Abuja, the Executive Vice Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the Commission, Mr Tunji Bello, said the regulator had already commenced investigations into pricing

practices in sectors, including cement, pharmaceuticals, baby formula, domestic aviation, and food distribution networks.
The FCCPC chief emphasised that while Nigeria operates a free-market system where profit-making is legitimate,

NNPCL'S UNACCOUNTED N210TRN AND THE BALAWUNTI QUESTION

Nigeria woke up to another of those thunderous figures that have a way of shaking the public square before the details have even settled. This time it was ₦210 trillion, a number so enormous that it instantly dominates imagination and travels faster than the explanations that must eventually follow. According to reports of proceedings at the Senate Committee on Public Accounts, lawmakers have summoned former officials of the national oil company, the Nigeria National Petroleum Company Limited (NNPCL), including its former group managing director Mele Kyari, a former chief financial officer Umar Ajia Isa, and the former head of National Petroleum Investment Management Services, Bala Wunti, to appear and explain entries contained in the financial records of the company between 2017 and 2023.

The figure itself emerged from two separate items flagged in audit reports. One relates to ₦103 trillion said to represent cumulative spending by joint venture partners through cash calls over several years, while the second concerns ₦107 trillion recorded in the company's financial statements as "sundry receivables" allegedly owed by banks and other entities. When these two figures are placed side by side, they immediately form the kind of number that leaps out of a headline and spreads across the country within minutes, generating alarm, speculation, and sometimes conclusions before the technical meaning of the figures has been properly unpacked. The figures are, without exaggeration, shocking. Even seasoned observers of public finance may pause for a moment and wonder how such a colossal number appears in a single conversation and how exactly the arithmetic behind it was constructed before explanations are laid out in full.

Anyone who has followed the workings of Nigeria's petroleum industry understands that petroleum accounting is rarely simple. The sector operates within a web of long-term investments, complex contractual arrangements, multi-party joint ventures, and project expenditures that often run for years before they are fully reconciled in financial statements. Figures that appear inside audit reports are frequently aggregated values representing transactions accumulated over time or accounting classifications that still require reconciliation rather than straightforward descriptions of

missing money.

None of this removes the responsibility of explanation, and it must be said clearly that the Senate committee is right to demand clarity. Oversight is a constitutional duty and one of the most important mechanisms through which public institutions are held accountable for the management of national resources. When auditors identify issues or inconsistencies within financial records, the correct response is explanation supported by documentation so that the public can understand the real meaning behind the numbers presented before them.

Yet there is another responsibility that must also be remembered in moments like this, and it is the responsibility to distinguish between a question and a verdict. Legislative hearings exist precisely because questions must be asked and answers must be tested against facts. Committees review audit reports, raise queries, and invite officials to provide clarifications while documents are examined and figures interpreted by those who handled them. Many issues that appear alarming at first glance are eventually resolved when the accounting details are properly understood, while others may indeed reveal deeper problems that demand corrective action. The essential point is that hearings represent the beginning of inquiry rather than its conclusion.

It is within this atmosphere that the name of Bala Wunti has entered the center of the conversation. To some observers, he is simply one among several former officials who have now been asked to appear before the committee. To others who have followed the trajectory of Nigeria's petroleum sector over the years, his name carries a professional history that deserves to be understood before judgments are pronounced.

Bala Wunti's journey within the petroleum industry was not the result of a sudden political elevation. It was shaped over decades of work inside a sector that demands both technical competence and managerial discipline. Rising through responsibilities that required a deep understanding of investment management, exploration financing, and operational oversight, he

eventually occupied strategic roles within Nigeria's upstream petroleum administration where decisions often involve billions of dollars and partnerships with international oil companies.

Professionals who operate in that environment understand the weight of such responsibilities. The oil industry is neither forgiving nor casual about leadership positions because the scale of its operations leaves little room for error. Those who spend long careers within it are constantly evaluated through the results of their work and through the professional scrutiny that surrounds every major project and financial decision.

For many colleagues and industry watchers, Wunti's reputation developed within that demanding environment where competence rather than noise often determines who rises to positions of responsibility. Over time he became known as a technocrat whose professional path reflected the rigours of the energy sector rather than the turbulence of partisan politics.

Beyond professional credentials, there is also the matter of personal character, which in the Nigerian context often carries moral significance. In many parts of Northern Nigeria, people sometimes describe a person by saying that his life is guided by the fear of his Creator. It is a description that has been attached to Bala Wunti more than once by individuals who have encountered him closely. The phrase does not claim perfection because no human being is beyond error, but it conveys a sense of moral caution and personal discipline that shapes how a person approaches responsibility.

For many who have known him either from afar or through professional contact, the present controversy therefore arrives with genuine surprise. It is not because questions should never be asked or because public officials should be shielded from scrutiny, but because the image many people formed about him over the years appears difficult to reconcile with the picture that a headline might suggest. Those who have watched his professional conduct closely often insist that Bala Maijama'a Wunti belongs to a class of technocrats whose strength lies in quiet diligence rather than flamboyant visibility, a man who built his path through careful work and professional discipline rather than through shortcuts that sometimes colour public life.

SECURITY THROUGH DIALOGUE: THE UBA SANI'S MODEL IN KADUNA STATE

Since assuming office in May 2023, Governor Uba Sani has placed security and peace building at the center of governance in Kaduna state. Leading a state long troubled by banditry, communal violence, and mass displacement, his administration has adopted a strategy that departs significantly from previous approaches. Rather than relying solely on force, the government has pursued dialogue, reconciliation, and community based stabilisation as tools for restoring peace.

This approach remains debated. Yet, it represents one of the most ambitious attempts in recent years to rethink how insecurity is managed at the state level in Northern Nigeria.

One of the most defining aspects of the administration's security policy is its emphasis on non-kinetic methods. The government initiated engagement with armed groups through traditional rulers, community intermediaries, and local stakeholders, encouraging surrender and reintegration.

A notable example is the peace engagement process in Birnin Gwari, one of the most dangerous areas in Kaduna for years. Communities that had suffered repeated attacks and mass displacement began experiencing gradual reopening of markets and return of economic activities following negotiations and security interventions.

The rationale behind this policy is straightforward. Military operations alone have not eliminated banditry in many parts of Northern Nigeria. By opening communication channels, the government aims to reduce violence, rebuild trust, and allow displaced populations to return home.

The point here is, saving lives

and stabilising communities should take precedence over purely punitive approaches.

Beyond engagement with armed groups, the administration has invested in community reconciliation initiatives. Kaduna's insecurity has often been driven by long standing tensions, including farmer herder conflicts and communal disputes.

The government has organised peace meetings involving religious leaders, traditional rulers, and local stakeholders across conflict affected areas. These dialogues aim to address root causes of violence rather than only responding to attacks.

In parts of Southern Kaduna, historically affected by communal clashes, the government has promoted mediation efforts and community trust building measures. These initiatives seek to reduce cycles of retaliation that have persisted for decades.

While such processes require time, they represent an attempt to build sustainable peace rather than temporary security.

The peace strategy has not replaced conventional security operations. Instead, the administration has combined dialogue with strengthened collaboration with federal security agencies.

The Kaduna state government continues to provide logistical support to security forces, enhance intelligence sharing, and encourage community participation through local vigilance structures. The idea is to integrate formal security operations with local knowledge and community networks.

This hybrid model recognises that modern security challenges require both enforcement and social engagement.

One measurable indicator of progress has been the gradual return of displaced persons in some communities. Years of violence had forced thousands to abandon homes, farms, and businesses.

The government has supported resettlement efforts, restoration of basic services, and reopening of transportation routes in areas where stability has improved. The reopening of weekly markets and resumption of farming activities in some locations have been cited by officials as evidence of growing confidence among residents.

Economic activity often serves as a practical test of security. Where markets reopen and farmers return, communities begin to rebuild.

At its core, the administration's strategy reflects a human centered

philosophy of security. The focus is not only on eliminating threats but also on addressing the social conditions that sustain conflict.

The government emphasises reintegration of repentant fighters, community participation in security management, and long term social stability. This approach assumes that peace is more sustainable when communities themselves become stakeholders in maintaining it.

Despite these efforts, the strategy remains controversial. Critics argue that negotiating with armed groups risks legitimising criminality and may not produce lasting results. Others question whether improvements are sufficient given the scale of insecurity historically experienced in the state.

However, governance in conflict environments often involves difficult choices. The administration's approach reflects a pragmatic attempt to balance immediate protection of lives with long term peace building.

Governor Uba Sani's security policy represents a significant shift in Kaduna state's response to violence. Through dialogue, reconciliation, community engagement, and collaboration with security agencies, the government seeks to move beyond purely military solutions toward sustainable peace.

Whether this model ultimately succeeds will depend on its long term impact. Yet, it has already reshaped the conversation about how security challenges in northern Nigeria can be addressed, placing peace building alongside enforcement as a central pillar of governance.

THE UN'S PASS MARK FOR NIGERIA'S DEMOCRACY

Apparently scoring Nigeria's democracy high, the United Nations (UN) affirmed that for over the past 27 years, the country's democracy has evolved into a defining feature of Nigeria's history and trajectory. This vote of confidence on Nigeria's democracy by the global body, which noted that the world is looking up to Nigeria for a successful democracy, stems from the consistent reform of the nation's electoral system which in the last 27 years has evolved from an organic to a digitalised system.

Speaking during a courtesy visit to the Chairman of the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC), Prof Joash Amupitan, in Abuja penultimate Thursday, the United Nations Resident Coordinator in Nigeria, Mohammed Malik Fall, while congratulating the INEC chairman on his appointment, commended the country "for managing democracy in what is probably the largest nation in terms of population, where organising elections carries immense stakes and complexity."

Accompanied by his colleague from the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) Resident Representative in Nigeria, Elsie G. Attafuaah, Fall stated that "not only the United Nations, but also the continent and we as individuals, look up to Nigeria."

"We admire you (Nigeria) not only for your steadiness over the past 27 years, during which democracy has evolved into a defining feature of Nigeria's history and trajectory, but also for managing democracy in what is probably the largest nation in terms of population, where organising elections carries immense stakes and complexity."

Describing the last Federal Capital Territory (FCT) area council polls as a successful one, Fall said, "For this reason, we want to express our prayers and best wishes for you and the entire commission as you succeed in this endeavour."

"As I said earlier, not only the United Nations, or West Africa, but also the world is looking to you. Your success will be our success; your success will inspire our pride. These are the words I wanted to bring with me today. We have been observing, and last weekend was a trial, a test—but a very successful one—and I want to congratulate

you for that."

He stated that the United Nations has global expertise in organising, guiding, and supporting elections, and have proven records and best practices collected across contexts that we are ready to put at your disposal as needed or requested.

Also speaking, Elsie G. Attafuaah, the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) Resident Representative in Nigeria, said: "I also appreciate the leadership here, working together to ensure transparent, inclusive, and credible elections year after year. Congratulations to you all."

"My remarks are to situate the conversation around what the UN could offer. Every year, we support about 60 elections globally. We have had a long-standing relationship with INEC since at least 1999, introducing technological advancements and improvements, and supporting inclusion from youth and gender perspectives."

Over the years, we have supported voter education, institutional strengthening, and embedded technical capacity where needed. Given this background and our partnership, we thought it important to hear from you where the needs are and what more we can do. Some potential entry points include leveraging existing UN programs.

"As the resident coordinator mentioned, there are 26 agencies, funds, and programmes, working closely under his leadership. We hope to bring the family together to leverage our assets, comparative advantages, and complementarities, particularly as we approach the 2027 elections."

"We also have critical reform processes and constitutional reforms underway, including the special seats bill, which we support. We have a parliamentary development program we could leverage to support the processes you are leading."

"Nigeria provides regional leadership through programmes like the Regional Partnership for Democracy, promoting homegrown democracy in Africa. We can leverage this as well."

"Finally, dedicated electoral support projects usually come with a formal request. If you seek additional support beyond existing programs, we are happy to continue the conversation about your needs

and how we can assist."

"We deeply appreciate the audience and the opportunity to support Nigeria, the largest democracy in Africa and the broader global community."

"If Nigeria succeeds, Africa advances. There is a reason it is called the "Giant of Africa." We look forward to working together to achieve these milestones for this great country. Thank you very much."

Responding, the INEC Chairman Prof Amupitan told the UN officials of the elections the commission was about to conduct, harped on the need for technical support, adding that the commission was embarking on weeding out the names of dead people from the voter register.

Blueprint is impressed by the UN's pass mark on Nigeria's democracy. We are particularly excited that despite the misgivings by some opposition parties that the West African nation was tilting towards a one party state as well as muffling dissenting voices, the global community is scoring Nigeria's democracy high.

This newspaper is, however, not unoblivious of the fact that democracy in Nigeria is yet to evolve to a desirable level where elections are free, fair, credible, and acceptable. Nigeria's elections are still characterised by vote-buying, technical glitches, political violence, weak rule of law, godfatherism, and other irregularities that cast doubts on their credibility.

While acknowledging the ongoing reforms of the electoral system, including the Electoral Act 2022 (Amendment) Bill which was recently signed into law by President Bola Ahmed Tinubu, we urge all the stakeholders in the Nigeria project, especially political parties and their candidates, to play by the rules in order to ensure free, fair, and credible elections in the country.

Nigerians must leverage the good will of the comity of nations to make our democracy the envy of other evolving democracies and systems of government. Political parties, especially, bear the patriotic responsibility to promote, uphold, and defend democratic ideals so that the nation's democracy will not only thrive but also flourish. Clearly, INEC alone cannot guarantee credible elections in the country.

For some years, our lecturers have taught us political economy and Marxist perspectives, particularly as they relate to the media. These ideas still echo strongly in my mind and conscience, especially when I reflect on Northern Nigeria, the region I hail from. When one considers the numerous social, political, and economic problems that have plagued the region for decades, it becomes deeply troubling that northerners continue to allow others to define, interpret, and circulate their narratives.

According to Karl Marx, those who control the means of production also control the means of mental production. In today's context, media ownership is a clear example of this argument. Those who own media platforms determine what is reported, how it is framed, and whose voices are amplified or silenced.

Several times, when I reflect on what a strong media system could do to accelerate development and address insecurity, poverty, and misrepresentation in the North, I feel deeply uncomfortable with the existing structure. Media has the power to shape perception, influence policy, and mobilise people. Yet this power remains largely underdeveloped in the North.

On December 2, 2025, I authored an article titled *Northerners Must Be Wise to Secure the Region*, published by some national dailies, including *Blueprint*. I remain grateful for the opportunity to contribute to public discourse through the dailies. The concluding paragraph of that article stated clearly: "A strong mass media platform also needs to be established in Northern Nigeria that can always be used to speak to the world about issues concerning the North."

The absence of a strong northern media presence became more obvious during periods when serious allegations and negative narratives such as claims of genocide circulated widely. Even before such narratives gained traction on international platforms, *Blueprint* made efforts to provide balance and clarification. However, one newspaper alone can find challenging to effectively counter global misinformation.

To better understand this situation, it is important to return briefly to Marxist and political economy theories of the media. Marx explains that journalists and media professionals,

who can be described as the working class in this context, often sell their skills to media owners in order to survive. As a result, they are constrained to work within the ideological and commercial interests of those who own the platforms. As Des Wilson once argued, no media organisation is established without a purpose, and that purpose inevitably reflects in its content. Private media organisations are largely profit-driven, while state-owned media often exist to promote government policies and activities.

This theoretical explanation helps us appreciate why ownership matters and why calls for regional media development should not be dismissed as mere sentiment.

It is within this context that the call by Isa Ali Pantami, a former minister of digital economy, for the establishment of strong northern media platforms becomes both timely and necessary. His position echoes the wisdom of Sir Ahmadu Bello, the Sardauna of Sokoto and premier of Northern Nigeria, who once declared that "If you don't blow your trumpet, nobody will blow it for you." This statement captures the essence of media power: if a people do not tell their own story, others will not do it for them and if they do tell the story for them they may often choose from angles that may be misleading, biased, or harmful.

Historically, the media has never been a neutral or passive institution. As far back as 1859, Henry Townsend established *Iwe Irohin* to promote literacy among the Yoruba and to spread religious ideas. His students later established their own newspapers, expanding media influence in Southern Nigeria. During the nationalist struggle, figures such as Herbert Macaulay and Nnamdi Azikiwe relied heavily on newspapers to challenge colonial rule. It was not armed struggle alone, but journalism and political writing, that mobilised public consciousness and contributed to Nigeria's independence. These historical examples confirm that the media is a powerful tool for social transformation.

Despite this lesson, Northern Nigeria still lacks strong, influential, and internationally competitive media institutions. Most radio stations in the region are local, have limited reach, and operate mainly in Hausa. Many

depend on western or national media outlets for news, largely because of inadequate resources to deploy reporters across the region. This structural weakness limits the ability of northern communities to speak for themselves.

Research supports this concern. A study conducted by Amina Salisu Mohammed titled "Coverage of Kidnapping in Northwest Nigeria: An Analysis of Daily Trust and The Guardian Newspapers" found that media coverage of kidnapping relied heavily on official sources, while the voices of victims and affected communities were largely absent. This gap further demonstrates the need for well-resourced regional media institutions.

Interestingly, Pantami has openly acknowledged this absence and emphasised the importance of addressing it. This issue deserves a prominent place on the agenda of the Northern Elders Forum (NEF) and other regional stakeholders. His advice should not be ignored. Wealthy individuals in the region should be willing to make deliberate financial sacrifices by investing in media institutions that serve the collective interest.

Furthermore, a proposed solution is the establishment of a multimedia platform such as *Arewa News* and TV, comprising television, radio, newspaper, and digital platforms. Such an organisation should employ well-trained journalists capable of reporting in English, Hausa, Arabic, and French, thereby projecting northern realities to both local and international audiences. This initiative would not only correct misrepresentation and highlight the true conditions of the region, but also create employment opportunities for many graduates.

In conclusion, the question is no longer whether the media is powerful—the answer is clearly yes. The real question is whether Northern Nigeria will heed its own history, heed the wisdom of the Sardauna, and invest in strong media institutions that can control its narrative, protect its image, and contribute meaningfully to development. If the North fails to tell its own story, others will continue to do so on their own terms.

Prof. Othman commended members of the committee for commitment to FUDMA's examination misconduct policies and for ensuring the adherence to due process, fairness, firmness and justice.

**UK announces road closures,
no-fly zones for Tinubu's state visit****By Abdullahi M. Gulloma**

Britain will impose airspace restrictions and deploy armed police officers in Windsor next week as President Bola Tinubu arrives for a state visit hosted by King Charles III.

Tinubu is expected to begin the visit in the company of his wife, Oluremi Tinubu Wednesday, March 18, with a reception at Windsor Castle.

Thames Valley Police in a statement on its website on Wednesday, said it is working with the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead, the Royal Household and other security partners.

The force said airspace restrictions over Windsor Castle, which are in place permanently throughout the year, would be extended on Wednesday, March 18, to cover the period from

7am to 11.59pm.

Chief Superintendent Adrian Hall of Thames Valley Police's Joint Operations Unit said the air restrictions formed part of a broader security operation for the visit.

"The air restrictions are just one part of our robust security operation for the state visit of Nigerian President Tinubu next week, with many measures you will see and others you will not.

"As a force, we have a vast amount of experience in policing Royal events in Windsor and significant planning, and preparation has gone into this event," Hall said.

He said the force would take a strong stance in enforcing the restrictions, warning that any breach would constitute a criminal offence under the Air Navigation Order and could lead to arrest.

"We will be taking a strong stance in enforcing the restrictions; anyone who breaches them will be committing a criminal offence under the Air Navigation Order and could be arrested."

The police chief said officers with specialist capabilities, including search teams, the Mounted Section, road policing, and armed units, would be deployed across Windsor, alongside neighbourhood policing and Project Servator resources.

"We will also be deploying numerous police officers to Windsor with specialist capabilities, including our search teams, Mounted Section, Roads Policing and armed units, while our neighbourhood and Project Servator resources will also be on the ground engaging with the public," he said.

The authorities will also deploy

an extensive closed-circuit television network, hostile vehicle mitigation barriers, and other undisclosed security measures for the event.

Hall said, "We will also be using the extensive CCTV network in Windsor, Hostile Vehicle Mitigation barriers, and many other security measures that you may not be able to see to make sure the event runs safely."

He urged members of the public to support the security operation by remaining vigilant.

**Benue killings:
Senate seeks
establishment
of military
base in Kwande

The Senate Thursday urged the federal government to establish a military base in Kwande, Benue state, to strengthen security and enable displaced residents to return safely.

The resolution followed a motion of urgent public importance raised by Sen. Emmanuel Udende (Benue Northeast) over escalating terrorist attacks across Kwande communities.

Udende said recent coordinated assaults by armed attackers in Kwande local government area left more than 20 residents dead and forced many families to flee.

He stated that the attackers targeted villages and local markets, leaving widespread destruction, displacement, and fear among residents struggling to rebuild their shattered communities.

The senator recalled that on February 5, 2026, assailants invaded a settlement in the area, killing several residents, injuring others, and destroying homes and properties.

He added that nearly 50 people were reportedly killed in the February attacks, while several residents remain missing as communities continue searching for their loved ones.

Udende said while victims were still mourning, another wave of deadly attacks occurred across parts of Kwande in March 2026, worsening the humanitarian crisis.

He stated further that on March 10, 2026, gunmen again invaded communities, killing about eleven people and spreading panic among already traumatised residents.

He also noted that another attack on March 5 in the Bachor community resulted in additional deaths and destruction of properties worth millions of naira.

He warned that intimidation and arrests of local vigilantes by security operatives could undermine cooperation between community volunteers and official security agencies.

Court declares Aiyedatiwa ineligible to seek reelection**By Barnabas Olabisi**

The Federal High Court in Akure has declared Ondo state governor, Lucky Aiyedatiwa, ineligible to contest the 2028 governorship election.

The court, presided over by Justice Toyin Adegoke, in a judgment delivered, Thursday, held that the Constitution does not provide for a situation where an elected president, vice president, governor, or deputy governor would spend more than eight years in office.

Aiyedatiwa was sworn in on 27 December 2023, to complete the tenure of the late Governor Oluwarotimi Akeredolu.

He was later sworn in again on 24 February 2025, after he was declared winner of the governorship election held on 16 November, 2024.

A chieftain of the ruling All Progressives Congress (APC), Akindele Egbuwalo, had approached the court in July 2025, to resolve the question of Governor Aiyedatiwa's eligibility to contest for a second term.

Egbuwalo, through his counsel, Adeniyi Akitola, sought an

interpretation of Section 137(3) of the Nigerian Constitution regarding the qualification of Aiyedatiwa to contest for a second term.

Justice Adegoke had initially fixed 28 January to decide whether Aiyedatiwa was qualified to re-contest, having been sworn in twice as governor of the state.

But the defendants stalled the

judgment by heading to the Court of Appeal in Abuja. The appeal court dismissed the defendants' objections and granted the lower court permission to proceed with the judgment.

In her verdict, Justice Adegoke held that the processes filed by the third to fifth defendants were deemed abandoned, having failed to participate during the hearing of

the suit.

She noted that only the processes of the plaintiff, first defendant, and second defendant would be considered.

Consequently, the court dismissed the objection raised by the first defendant, holding that the suit was neither speculative nor academic, and that it was a valid cause of action.

Foreign scholarship: NSCDC parades fake NYSC member who defrauded 7

The Nigeria Security and Civil Defence Corps (NSCDC) Federal Capital Territory (FCT) has paraded a suspected fake National Youth Service Corps (NYSC) member over alleged forgery, impersonation and fraud involving parents seeking foreign scholarship for their children.

The suspect, 27-year-old Joseph Nanmwa Philips from Plateau state, allegedly forged an NYSC call-up letter to secure placement at the International Model Science Academy in Kwali, a subsidiary of the National Mathematical Centre.

An online media had on Tuesday, 10th March, 2026, wrongly reported that the suspect was held for 65 days without trial, a claim Commandant Odumosu described as misleading and untrue.

Parading the suspect before newsmen, Thursday in Abuja, FCT Commandant of the Corps, Dr. Olusola Odumosu, said Philips was arrested on February 6 following complaints of forgery, hacking and impersonation of officials of the National Mathematical Centre on social media.

He said investigations by the Corps revealed that the suspect allegedly cloned several Cambridge University email addresses and used them to convince parents that their children could secure scholarships abroad.

Dr. Odumosu said the suspect allegedly collected money from parents for scholarship registration, study materials and extra lessons meant to prepare candidates for the supposed examination.

The Commandant added that about N1.3 million was allegedly obtained from unsuspecting parents through the scheme.

Items recovered from the suspect include an NYSC uniform, a forged call-up letter, and documents showing financial transactions

between the suspect and some parents.

The NSCDC said the suspect was granted bail in line with the Administration of Criminal Justice Act, but remained in custody after failing to meet the bail conditions.

The command added that a Magistrate Court in Wuse Zone II, Abuja, subsequently issued a remand order to enable further investigation.

Responding to the allegations, the suspected fake corps member, Philips, admitted that he forged the NYSC call-up letter used at the school in Kwali but insisted that his actions were influenced by a disagreement with the school management over unpaid teaching allowances.

Sokoto, Zamfara, Kebbi, 8 others meningitis high-risk states – NiMet

The Nigeria Meteorological Agency (NiMet) has issued a public health alert warning residents of several northern states about the heightened risk of Cerebrospinal Meningitis.

NiMet issued the warning in a statement on its official X account, Thursday, highlighting the need for vigilance and prompt action to prevent the spread of the potentially life-threatening infection.

The alert categorised states by risk levels, with the highest risk observed in Sokoto, Zamfara, Kebbi, Katsina, Kano, Jigawa, Adamawa, Gombe, Bauchi, Yobe, and Borno.

Residents of central states were advised

to exercise moderate vigilance, while Plateau, Oyo, Cross River, Edo, Ekiti, and Enugu were considered low vigilance areas.

Cerebrospinal Meningitis, according to the agency, is a serious infection affecting the brain and spinal cord, commonly caused by the bacterium *Neisseria meningitidis*.

It spreads through respiratory droplets, especially in crowded or poorly ventilated places.

The agency further noted that the disease can progress rapidly and may become life-threatening within hours if untreated.

However, early diagnosis and prompt antibiotic treatment greatly improve survival and reduce complications.

NiMet also highlighted the groups

most vulnerable to the infection, explaining that “children and young adults, people living in overcrowded settings, individuals exposed to dry, dusty environments, and persons with weakened immune systems are at higher risk.”

The agency emphasised early recognition of symptoms as key to preventing fatalities, listing sudden high fever, severe headache, neck stiffness, nausea or vomiting, and sensitivity to light as warning signs.

To reduce the risk of infection, NiMet encouraged the public to “Get vaccinated, practice good hygiene, avoid overcrowding, and seek early medical care. Vaccination, it said, is one of the most effective ways to prevent meningitis.

“Good hygiene, such as regular handwashing and avoiding the sharing of personal items, can also help reduce transmission, while ensuring good ventilation in homes, schools, and public spaces is important to limit exposure.

“Watch for symptoms such as high fever, severe headache, neck stiffness, vomiting, and sensitivity to light, and seek prompt medical attention if any occur.”

The agency called for community participation in health awareness campaigns, stating that following public health guidance and staying informed can protect both individuals and the wider community.

“Protect yourself and your community. Early awareness, vaccination, and prompt treatment save lives,” it added.

2 men jailed 15 years for raping, flogging housemaid to death

A Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence court sitting in Ikeja, Lagos Thursday sentenced two men, 22-year-old painter, Edidiong Edem, and 21-year-old mechanic, Alex Effiong Etim, to 15-year imprisonment for flogging their brother’s 12-year-old housemaid with a broom, which led to her death.

Justice Abiola Soladoye sentenced

the defendants, Edem and Etim after they entered a plea bargain agreement.

The victim was working for the convicts’ brother as a housemaid. It all started when their brother’s wife was admitted in a hospital and their brother was away to stay with his wife in the facility. While they were away, the defendants, Edem and Etim, started having unlawful sexual intercourse with the victim. One of the defendants will have unlawful sexual intercourse with her in the

morning and the other defendant will have sexual intercourse with her at night. It lasted throughout the time their brother’s wife was admitted in the hospital.

The defendants later had a misunderstanding with the victim regarding the unlawful act, then they flogged her with a broom on her legs, she sustained injuries, which were later infected with tetanus and she died.

The charge reads: “Edidiong Edem (M), Alex Effiong (M), that you

sometime in the month of January, 2022 at Military Estate, Eleko, Ibeju-Lekki, Lagos in Ikeja Judiciary Division, did recklessly and without regard for human life, flogged one (F) aged (12) years with a broom on her legs, which caused her injuries that got infected with tetanus and led to her death.”

The offence is involuntary manslaughter which contravenes Sections 224 of the Criminal Law C.17, Vol 3 of Lagos state, 2015.

President Godswill Akpabio, his deputy, Senator Barau Jibrin (Kano North), rose through Order 20 of the Senate's Standing Rule to puncture Abaribe's defection from APGA which, according to him, has no division or crisis at the national level.

"Mr President, as directed by you, I've gone through the letters forwarded to you and read by you on defections of the Nine Senators from some minority parties into ADC, but strongly observed that one of the parties (APGA) where Abaribe defected from, is not engulfed by any crisis or divisions, particularly at the National level.

"Abaribe's defection, as clearly stated in section 68 (1b and g) of the 1999 Constitution as amended, is clearly against the provisions of the law and

warrants you to do the needful as far as Abia South senatorial seat is concerned," he said.

The section states: "(1) A member of the Senate or of the House of Representatives shall vacate his seat in the House of which he is a member if - (a) he becomes a member of another legislative house.

(b) any other circumstances arise that, if he were not a member of the Senate or the House of Representatives, would cause him to be disqualified for election as a member;

(g) If he/she defects from the political party that sponsored him for

the election without the party having divisions."

And accordingly, Senate President Akpabio called on Abaribe to respond to observation made against his defection.

Abaribe, in his response, tacitly admitted that APGA is not divided but disclosed that the party sacked him as a member since September 2025, and that since one must belong to a political party to be in the Senate, he decided to defect to the ADC.

...**Bamidele counters**

Apparently dissatisfied with

Abaribe's response, Senate Leader Michael Opeyemi Bamidele (Ekiti Central), in his submission, said the purported sacking of Abaribe from APGA in September last year was even enough ground for his seat to be declared vacant as stated in section 68 (1b) of the 1999 Constitution.

Consequently, the President of the Senate, in his ruling, gave Abaribe one week to either withdraw his letter of defection or come up with convincing reason.

Aside the nine Senators who defected to ADC, two other Senators also officialised their defections from PDP to their new parties.

They are PDP's Senator Seriake Dickson (Bayelsa West) who defected to Nigeria Democratic Party (ND) and Senator Olalere Oyewunmi (Osun West) to Accord Party.

...**ADC as main opposition**

Meanwhile, the gale of defections has made ADC, now with 9 Senators, to be the main opposition party in the Senate, depleting PDP to 6, while APGA remains 1, NNPP 1, NDC 1 and Accord Party 1.

When added to 87 seats controlled by the APC, the total now comes to 106, with 3 seats namely; Nasarawa North, Enugu North and Rivers South East, vacant due to death of the affected lawmakers.

...**12 Reps defect, APC, ADC gain**

Like in the Senate, the defection gale also continued in the Green Chamber as twelve members of the House of Representatives announced their resignation from their initial political parties, to join new platforms.

There are also indications that some five others may be doing same in no distant time.

Among the 12 members whose defection was announced Thursday are six from the PDP for the All Progressives Congress (APC), while five members dumped the LP, and the PDP for the ADC, and one member moving from the Young Progressives Party (YPP) to the ADC.

Members who defected from the PDP to the APC are; James Barka (Adamawa), Kwamoti Bitrus Laori (Adamawa), Zakaria Nyampa (Adamawa), Kobis Thimnu (Adamawa), Midala Balami (Borno), and Mohammed Bargaja (Sokoto).

Those who defected to the ADC include Afam Victor Ogene (Anambra), Peter Aniekwe (Anambra), Lilian Orogbu (Anambra), Jessey Onakalusi (Lagos), and Murphy Osaro Omoruyi (Edo).

Announcing the development, Deputy Speaker of the House, Benjamin Kalu, who presided at the plenary, disclosed that some other members had also written to the leadership of the House, of their intention to change their political parties, adding however, that their letters could not be read in their absence.

According to him, "the letters would only be read when the concerned lawmakers are present on the floor of the House."

Amid M/East war, FCCPC moves against price manipulations

the Commission will not tolerate practices that exploit consumers or artificially drive inflationary pressures.

"The Federal Competition and Consumer Protection Commission (FCCPC) is Nigeria's primary competition and consumer protection regulator.

"Established under the Federal Competition and Consumer Protection Act (FCCPA) 2018, the Commission is empowered to regulate market conduct, eliminate anti-competitive practices, and protect consumers from unfair, unreasonable and unjust treatment," he said.

Bello clarified that the commission does not regulate prices directly but intervenes when market practices cross into exploitation.

"It is important to emphasise at the outset that the FCCPC does not control prices. Nigeria operates a free-market economy, and profit-making is legitimate.

"However, where market conduct crosses into the territory of exploitation or unfair practices, the Commission is empowered to intervene," he said.

According to him, such intervention becomes necessary when businesses engage in conduct that artificially inflates prices or deceives consumers.

"In such cases, the FCCPC acts against conduct that artificially drives inflationary pressure, including exploitative pricing, deceptive re-packaging, supply manipulation and artificial scarcity," he said.

The FCCPC boss disclosed that Nigeria's inflation trajectory had begun to moderate significantly following months of elevated price pressures.

He cited recent data from the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) showing a major drop in headline inflation.

"Data released by the National Bureau of Statistics indicate that headline inflation, which rose significantly through 2024 and peaked above 34 percent in 2025, has come down significantly to around 15 percent.

"This development reflects a number of macroeconomic adjustments, including relative stability in foreign exchange conditions, improved supply in certain consumer goods markets, and evolving energy price dynamics," Bello said.

He attributed the improving economic indicators partly to the reform programme of President Bola Ahmed Tinubu.

"Without a doubt, this positive signal is attributable to the bold economic reforms initiated by President Bola Ahmed Tinubu," he said.

The FCCPC chief noted that the Commission's role is to ensure that improvements in macroeconomic conditions translate into real relief for consumers.

"The FCCPC's mandate is not to control prices but to ensure that markets remain competitive, transparent and free from manipulation," he said.

Bello disclosed that the Commission had undertaken several enforcement actions across the country, following investigations into unethical commercial practices.

According to him, some warehouses in Kano were sealed after investigators uncovered deceptive product measurements in the textile market.

"As a matter of fact, following weeks of discreet investigations, we had cause to seal off some warehouses in Kano in November 2025 for stocking and selling fabrics that fell short of the measurements on the label.

"Sanctions were imposed on the violators, and they were made to undergo a remedial process, including giving a firm undertaking never to engage in such unethical practices again," he said.

The commission also assisted consumers in recovering significant sums through dispute resolution mechanisms.

"In championing the cause of Nigerian consumers, the Commission assisted in recovering over N10 billion between January and October 2025 alone by way of helping consumers get refunds through dispute resolution," he said.

Bello explained that FCCPC's nationwide network of offices enables rapid response to consumer complaints.

"Daily, through our fully functional state offices and zonal commands numbering 15 spread across the country, the Commission is able to assist Nigerian consumers get justice quickly when in distress instead of going to the court, which often takes time," he said.

The FCCPC chief also disclosed that the Commission recently sealed the headquarters of an electricity distribution company over violations of consumer rights.

"In fact, we had cause to seal off the administrative headquarters of an electricity distribution company in Lagos for days recently, for violating the rights of some of their consumers, until they did the right thing," he said.

He said the commission had also intervened in cases involving property developers who failed to deliver houses after collecting payments from buyers.

...**On legal successes**

Highlighting recent legal successes, the FCCPC chief said the Commission secured landmark judicial victories in 2025 that strengthened its regulatory authority.

"In February 2025, the Lagos Federal High Court affirmed the Commission's authority to regulate competition and consumer protection in Nigeria.

"That singular judgment solidified the Commission's power as the lead regulator across all sectors in Nigeria," he said.

Bello also cited the tribunal ruling against Meta Platforms and WhatsApp.

"In April 2025, the Competition and Consumer Protection Tribunal ruled in favour of the FCCPC in the appeal filed by Meta Platforms Incorporated and WhatsApp LLC.

"The Tribunal upheld the Commission's decision, including the imposition of a \$220 million administrative penalty and \$35,000 investigation cost," he said.

He said the commission is currently probing airline pricing practices following

widespread complaints from Nigerian travellers.

"The FCCPC has also undertaken a review of pricing practices in Nigeria's domestic aviation sector following widespread consumer complaints regarding sharp ticket price spikes during peak travel periods," he said.

According to the interim report released two weeks ago, the difference between peak and off-peak fares was substantial.

"On certain routes, the difference between peak and post-peak fares reached approximately between ₦405,000 and ₦650,000 per ticket," he said.

He warned that airlines could be ordered to refund passengers if exploitative pricing is confirmed.

"For those who have been taken undue advantage of by the airlines through exploitative pricing during the last Yuletide season, one of the options of redress the Commission is looking at is mandating them to make refund to travellers," he said.

...**On drop in staple foods**

The FCCPC chief also pointed to significant declines in staple food prices.

"A bag of rice, which sold for around N95,000 in 2024, now goes for N53,000.

The average price of brown beans fell from N2,798 per kilo in 2024 to N1,760 in 2025 and has further declined to N1,400 this year," he said.

Bello added that other staple commodities also recorded declines.

"The price of white garri dropped from N1,198 per kilogram in 2024 to N846 in 2025 and continued to decline in 2026 to N750 per kilogram.

"Also, the average price of tomatoes decreased from N1,465 per kilogram in

The statement also praised citizens "from all walks of life who stood against the enemy" and emphasized resilience in the face of adversity.

His statement further reads: "This is something that I share with the people who have lost their ones because I lost my father, I lost my wife.

"My sister lost her child as well as the husband who has been martyred.

"But what it makes it easier for us to endure all these plights is to trust the grace of God and to know that patience is going to resolve it.

"I assure everyone that we will not ignore the fact that we are going to revenge our martyrs.

"It is not only about the fact that they martyred our supreme leader.

"And it is not only about him, it is about every single countryman that has been killed during the recent war."

The statement signalled a willingness to continue the war that has disrupted global energy supplies, international travel and the relative

safety enjoyed by the Gulf Arab states.

Iran's unrelenting attacks on shipping traffic and energy infrastructure in the Persian Gulf had earlier pushed oil back above \$100 a barrel.

Iran is trying to inflict enough global economic pain to pressure the United States and Israel to halt their bombardment, which began on February 28, killing the Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, Mojtaba's father, and the younger Khamenei's wife.

U.S. and Israeli strikes have exacted a heavy toll on Iran's leadership, military and ballistic missile programme but have failed to topple the government, which U.S. President Donald Trump has at times suggested is his goal.

Trump has promised to "finish the job," even though he claimed Iran is "virtually destroyed." He said in a social media post Thursday that ensuring Iran does not develop a nuclear weapon has a higher priority than soaring oil prices.

The U.S. military said Thursday that American forces have now struck more than 6,000 targets since the operation against Iran began, including more than 30 minelaying vessels.

...**Iran's fight-back**

Iran-backed Hezbollah militants meanwhile launched some 200 rockets from Lebanon at northern Israel while sirens rang out and loud booms from the interception of Iranian missiles could be heard in other areas. Israel launched another wave of attacks on Tehran and in Lebanon, where 11 people were killed.

The U.N. refugee agency said up to 3.2 million people in Iran have been displaced by the ongoing war.

It said most have fled from Tehran and other major cities toward the north of the country or rural areas. Around 800,000 people have been internally displaced in Lebanon, prompting fears of a humanitarian crisis.

Tinubu's UK Royal visit reflects Nigeria's growing global influence – HAI

President Tinubu and his wife, Oluremi Tinubu, are expected to begin a historic two-day state visit to the United Kingdom on Wednesday, March 18, 2026, at the invitation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla.

HAI in a statement by its director of Press and Communications, Ernest Omo, said the visit, the first of its kind in nearly four decades, will take place at Windsor Castle rather than Buckingham Palace, a development the group described as symbolic of elevated ties and recognition of both the Nigerian president and the country's importance within the Commonwealth and the United Kingdom.

Omo urged Nigerians to see the visit as underscoring the enduring friendship between Nigeria and the United Kingdom, and as signaling a renewed era of cooperation in diplomacy, trade, security and cultural exchange.

Police nab 'Super M' in Mushin night raid, recover locally made pistol

The Lagos State Police Command has recorded another operational breakthrough, following the arrest of a suspected criminal and

recovery of a locally made firearm during a routine patrol in the Mushin area of the state.

The suspect, identified as Dare Shogaolu, 30, popularly known as Super M, was apprehended on March 5, 2026, about 10:00

by operatives of the Anti-Crime Patrol Team attached to the Mushin Division. The team, led by the Divisional Police Officer, intercepted the suspect along the LUTH Road axis during a stop-and-search exercise.

Police spokesperson, SP Abimbola Adebisi, stated that the officers became suspicious after noticing the suspect carrying a white and orange-yellow polythene bag. A search conducted on the spot led to the recovery of a locally made pistol concealed inside the bag.

"Additional items reportedly found in his possession include a black leather purse, some charms believed to be used for protection, and three pairs of slippers. Investigators say the discovery raised further suspicion about the suspect's activities in the area.

"Preliminary findings by the police indicate that the suspect may have been linked to several disturbances and criminal incidents within the Mushin community. He is currently in police custody while detectives continue interrogation and intelligence gathering aimed at identifying and arresting other members of the suspected gang," Abimbola stated.

Customs intercepts 222 explosives, 120 sacks of lithium in Kwara

Nigeria Customs Service, Kwara area command, Thursday, said it intercepted 222 units of used compressors, a component being used for the production of explosive devices in Eiyenkorin, a suburb of Ilorin, the Kwara state capital.

Also intercepted by the command's operatives are 120 sacks of illegally mined lithium ore intercepted at Alapa/ Banni area of Kwara.

The intercepted used compressors according to the customs area controller, Najeem Ogundeyi, is a major component being used for the production of explosive devices.

"Do you know what these compressors are used for? All the security men here know what they use it for. They use it for the production of explosives that you see around and that is why we intercepted them," he told news men.

Those in attendance were the representatives of the Nigerian Immigration Service, Nigerian Correctional Services, Police, Federal Fire Service, National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) and Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC).

Conducting journalists round the seizures made at the command's headquarters Ilorin Wednesday, Oguniyi said the items were concealed inside a truck containing some other contraband items.

He regretted that despite his earlier warning that the command under his watch would not tolerate activities of smuggling and illegal trade, some persons still devised different means to perpetrate their illegal trade.

FG reaffirms commitment to addressing glaucoma, calls for effective awareness

The Minister of State for Health and Social Welfare, Dr Iziq Adekunle Salako, Thursday, reaffirmed the federal government's commitment to addressing glaucoma.

He gave the assurance at a press briefing as part of activities marking the commemoration of 2026 World Glaucoma Week in Abuja.

The minister stated that government is prioritising integrated eye care services across primary, secondary, and tertiary levels to ensure early detection and management of glaucoma, under the National Eye Health Strategic Development Plan 2024-2028.

He said: "We have launched the Nigeria Glaucoma Guidelines and Toolkit to standardise diagnosis, treatment, and referral protocols, empowering healthcare workers nationwide to deliver high-quality care."

Dr Salako states that ophthalmologists from 36 states and the FCT have been trained on these guidelines, empowering them to step down the training in their respective states.

Additionally, through JigiBola2.0, the Effective Spectacle Coverage Initiative Nigeria, over 2,220 Primary Health Care Workers across 16 states have been trained and equipped with basic kits to carry out vision screening and refer to the

next point of care as necessary.

He recalled that in 2025 commemoration, the ministry provided free examinations and free glaucoma medication (for those already diagnosed) in the FCT and coordinated Commissioners of Health all over the country for a similar exercise.

Describing glaucoma as a grave public health challenge, Dr. Salako stated that the theme of this year's event "Uniting for a Glaucoma-Free World," is a clarion call

on all governments, healthcare providers, communities, and individual to come together in the fight against this silent thief of sight, adding that early detection through simple, painless tests is the critical element and "if you are diagnosed with glaucoma, strict adherence to the prescriptions by your doctor will prevent progression and save your sight," Salako stated.

The minister added that as part of the activities to commemorate this year's

World Glaucoma Week, the ministry, in collaboration with state governments, professional bodies and partners, is rolling out nationwide activities including free glaucoma examinations at selected 38 health facilities in 11 states and the FCT, adding that public awareness campaigns via traditional and non-traditional media including the social media on the risk factors such as the black race, family history, age, and high blood pressure is also being heightened.

Ramadan: Islamic scholars link safety in aviation sector to fear of God, discipline

that the theme of this year's event captures the urgency and importance of transforming Nigeria's diagnostic landscape into one that is resilient, sustainable, and capable of delivering improved health outcomes for every Nigerian.

"A well-integrated and coordinated diagnostic system is indispensable for quality healthcare delivery. Whether in a primary healthcare centre in a rural community or a tertiary hospital in a major city, access to reliable diagnostic services empowers healthcare providers to make informed decisions that

improve patient outcomes and ensure optimal use of resources," he stated.

He further said the ministry recognises that strengthening diagnostics requires more than infrastructure, but also strong governance, effective partnerships, a skilled workforce, functional laboratory networks, robust regulatory oversight, and sustainable financing; in addition to deliberate investment in local capacity development and domestic production of diagnostic technologies.

Rather, they wept and their eyes overflowed with tears, out of grief that they could not find anything to spend in the cause of Allah The Almighty.

On the other hand, those who have enough means to spend withhold and refrain from spending. It is as if they wait to be replaced by their Lord with others and annihilated due to their greediness, stinginess and the fact that they do not deserve to be in the party of Allah The Almighty. They did not deserve to be among those covered up with His care, of those selected to be worthy of this nearness and these acts of obedience, of those worthy of coming out after fasting in the state of righteousness referred to by Allah The Almighty who Says (what means): *{O you who have believed, decreed upon you is fasting as it was decreed upon those before you that you may become righteous.}* [Quran 2:183]

The people who have attained the nearness of Allah The Almighty comes out of Ramadan righteous, with the signs of piety, forgiveness and emancipation from Hell visible on them. They come out more devoted to Allah The Almighty, more ascetic in this world, more upright, more loving and much closer to his Lord, more observant of His commands and prohibitions, more kind-hearted, more tearful, and more submissive outwardly and inwardly. All of this indicates that a person has been forgiven, granted mercy or emancipated from Hell. He comes in a better state in terms of love for and remembrance of Allah The Almighty and longing to meet Him.

Other duties pertaining to the last ten days include:

- 1- I'tikaaf (staying in seclusion)
- 2- Exerting greater effort and care concerning the acceptance of deeds.

With the coming of these ten days and nights, striving begins in earnest



where one stands in the presence of his Lord with full devotion, showing Him what causes his Lord to be pleased with him, gives him generously, loves him, draws closer to him, delivers him from his deplorable state, guards him, defend him and provides for him.

As these days come to an end, one should strive harder and draw closer (to his Lord), wishing that his outcome would appear and brighten his face. He should hope that his outcome would be good during those days, and dread failure and rejection of his deeds as stated by the Messenger of Allah, *:"Disgraced be the one who witnesses Ramadan without being forgiven! Disgraced be the one who witnesses Ramadan without being forgiven! Disgraced be the one who witnesses Ramadan without being forgiven, then, may Allah keep him far (from Paradise) and admit him to Hell! Say Aameen!"* I then said, 'Aameen.'" [At-Tabaraani]

Once Ramadan is over, what do you do? You give up standing (at night in prayer), fasting, remembrance (of Allah The Almighty) and recitation of the Quran. This is the dark state which afflicts the believers after Ramadan as if they have neither stood (in prayer), nor fasted, nor drawn closer to their Lord, nor recited the Quran. This state, then, requires the believers, in these days, to strive day and night in prayer, remembrance (of Allah The Almighty) and recitation of the Quran.

The righteous predecessors in the past did not concern themselves with how much they spent and strove, in so much as whether or not it was accepted from them. In other words they spent their time, property, effort and souls, and towards the end they waited apprehensively, not knowing whether their deeds would be accepted from them. After one spends his day in fasting and night in standing (in prayer), after he spends his property and soul, and striving harder in all acts of obedience, he then stands waiting, wondering after all of this whether, his deeds will be accepted.

The believers do so after a period of great striving rather than after their indulgence, negligence, sleep and laziness. It was their habit to hasten to good, as clarified by Allah The Almighty. They used to hasten to Allah The Almighty in spending their property and soul; and if they found nothing to spend for the sake of Allah The Almighty, they would weep and their eyes would overflow with tears,

out of grief over finding nothing to spend. Then, towards the end of their deeds, the first thing, as described by Allah The Almighty, to possess their hearts, worry them, and make them sleepless, was whether or not their deeds had been accepted. In relation to this Allah The Almighty Says (what means): *{And they who give what they give while their hearts are fearful because they will be returning to their Lord.}* [Quran 23:60]

'Aa'ishah, may Allah be pleased with her, asked whether they are those who neither pray nor fast, but the Prophet said: "No! They are those who pray, fast, give in charity, and do such-and-such (righteous)

deeds, and then feel afraid that they would not be accepted from them." [At-Tirmithi and Ibn Maajah] It is the explanation of the words of Allah The Almighty who Says (what means): *{Indeed, Allah only accepts from the righteous [who fear Him].}* [Quran 5:27] Ramadan has been opened so that one would fear Allah The Almighty. So, who has attained that righteousness that comes at the end of his deeds and say that his deeds have been accepted, and that he has to wait for the reward of Allah The Almighty?

It was narrated by Al-Haafith Ibn Hajar on the authority of Ibn 'Umar, may Allah be pleased with them both, that he said, "Were I to know that Allah The Almighty accepted from me of my deeds (even as little as) an atom's weight, or (as small amount as) a Dirham in charity, nothing absent would have been dearer to me than death." [Fat-h Al-Baari] In confirmation of that, Allah The Almighty Says (what means): *{Indeed, Allah only accepts from the righteous [who fear Him].}* [Quran 5:27]

It may be argued that if this is the case, nothing remains for him in this world. He worked to attain the forgiveness and mercy of Allah The

Almighty and emancipation from Hell, perchance Allah The Almighty would accept his deed, turn to him in repentance, and deliver him from the Fire: *{So he who is drawn away from the Fire and admitted to Paradise has attained [his desire].}* [Quran 3:185] If he has attained his desire, then, why would he like to stay in this world?

He does all of this in the world just for the sake of the moment when: *{Indeed, Allah only accepts from the righteous [who fear Him].}* [Quran 5:27]

This is why they were mainly concerned with the acceptance of the deed after striving their utmost in it. This is the very state in which the believers in should be in these days: to consider what they have sent forward of deeds to be fit for the forgiveness, and whether or not these deeds would be accepted. This is confirmed by the Messenger of Allah in his statement: "Disappointed and lost is the one who witnesses Ramadan without his being forgiven." [At-Tabaraani] This is the one whose deeds were neither accepted nor were a cause of forgiveness.

X-Raying the quiet operational strategy within NAHCON

There has been an unusual calm within the National Hajj Commission of Nigeria (NAHCON) since the new chairman, Ismail Yusuf Abba, assumed office. Unlike the typical fanfare that accompanies new public appointments, the commission has witnessed more subdued public pronouncements, even as several administrative activities appear to be unfolding behind the scenes.

In Nigeria's public service environment, congratulatory messages and the description of appointments as "befitting" often embolden new office holders to project confidence and make sweeping declarations. Such displays have become a familiar pattern. However, developments within NAHCON since Abba took office suggest a departure from that tradition, as the new chairman appears to have adopted a more restrained approach.

Part of the reason may lie in the timing of his appointment. Preparations for the 2026 Hajj exercise were already far advanced before he assumed office, leaving little room for immediate structural changes. At best, his role at this stage may be to manage ongoing arrangements while gradually setting the tone for his administrative style and long-term direction.

Rather than making ambitious promises, Abba appears to be focusing on internal processes and institutional alignment. His approach suggests an attempt to reposition NAHCON more firmly as a regulatory and oversight body,

instead of an institution deeply entangled in operational activities alongside state pilgrims boards and private tour operators.

Early policy signals from the commission indicate a push toward improving operational coordination and compliance. For instance, NAHCON recently held strategic engagements with its Saudi service provider, Mashariq Aldhababiya, where both sides agreed to strengthen data management processes, ensure accurate uploads of pilgrims' information and verify accommodation contracts before departure. The initiative followed challenges experienced during the 2025 Hajj, particularly data mismatches involving flight manifests, contract numbers and accommodation allocations.

The commission has also resolved to intensify compliance checks at departure centres and establish a joint situation room with its Saudi partners to provide

real-time operational updates and promptly address emerging issues. These measures are expected to improve coordination and reduce administrative lapses during the pilgrimage exercise.

This measured style contrasts with past instances where newly appointed officials rushed to make bold promises, including pledges to drastically reduce Hajj fares without fully grasping the complexities involved in the cost structure of the pilgrimage. In some cases, such declarations later proved difficult to sustain.

Abba appears determined to avoid such traps. By focusing on regulatory compliance, operational efficiency and improved coordination among stakeholders, he may be attempting to reshape the orientation of Hajj managers toward consistency and professionalism.

Still, redirecting NAHCON toward a purely regulatory role may not be an easy task. The operational relationship between the commission, state Muslim pilgrims welfare boards and private tour operators remains deeply intertwined. Untangling those roles while maintaining efficiency will likely be one of the major challenges of his tenure.

Ultimately, the effectiveness of this quiet approach will only become clear with time. Public offices are not judged by early impressions but by sustained results. For now, the emerging pattern suggests a leadership style that prefers to work with minimal noise while allowing outcomes to speak for themselves.

The dangerous illusion of war with Iran

On November 6, 2024, I warned that celebrating Donald Trump's return to power as a guarantee of global stability was dangerously naive. The claim that a Trump presidency would calm the world ignored the structural realities of power politics in the Middle East.

Today that illusion has collapsed. The region is now engulfed in one of the most dangerous escalations in decades. More than 13 countries are directly or indirectly entangled in a widening confrontation. What many dismissed as alarmism has arrived with brutal clarity, great-power brinkmanship has once again turned the Middle East into the world's most combustible geopolitical theatre.

Wars rarely begin where politicians claim they do. This one did not start with the assassination of Iran's supreme leader or the bombardment of Iranian territory. Its roots stretch much further back into the unresolved consequences of one of the most consequential covert interventions of the 20th century.

In 1953, the United States and Britain orchestrated the overthrow of Iran's democratically elected prime minister, Mohammad Mossadegh, through what became known as Operation Ajax. Mossadegh's offense was straightforward, he nationalised Iran's oil industry, challenging Western control over one of the region's most valuable resources.

The coup reinstated Mohammad Reza Pahlavi, the Shah of Iran, whose rule grew increasingly autocratic under Western patronage. For decades, repression was justified as the price of stability. But stability imposed through force rarely lasts. The grievances generated during that period eventually erupted in the 1979 revolution, which brought Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini to power and transformed Iran into the Islamic Republic we know today.

In intelligence terminology, this phenomenon has a name, 'blowback'. It describes the unintended consequences of covert intervention consequences that often surface years or even decades later.

The current confrontation is, in many ways, a textbook example. Those advocating regime change in Tehran often assume that removing the leadership will automatically produce a democratic transition. It is an appealing narrative, but history has repeatedly demonstrated how detached it is from reality.

Consider recent precedents. After 2001, the United States dismantled the Taliban regime in Afghanistan only to watch it return to power two decades later. The 2003 invasion of Iraq toppled its government but unleashed sectarian violence and insurgency that destabilised the region for years. Libya's 2011 intervention removed yet shattered the state, leaving rival authorities and armed militias competing for power.

In each case, the promise was the same, remove the regime and stability will follow. In each case, the opposite happened. Iran, however, is even more complex. Its political system is not built around a single personality but around an entrenched network of clerical authority, security institutions and bureaucratic continuity. It is not merely a military force. It is an economic powerhouse, a political actor and a central pillar of the state's power structure.

This is why the idea that airstrikes or targeted

assassinations can simply "flip the switch" on regime change reflects a fundamental misunderstanding of how states actually function.

When a country perceives itself under existential attack, internal divisions often shrink rather than expand. External pressure tends to consolidate power within the security apparatus, not weaken it.

Equally troubling is the legal framework surrounding the current escalation. Under the United States Constitution, the authority to declare war rests with Congress not the president. Sustained hostilities and leadership targeting push the boundaries of executive authority in ways that are constitutionally fragile at best.

International law is equally clear. The Charter restricts the use of force to self-defence against an armed attack or when authorised by the Security Council. Preventive war based on speculative threats stretches those principles to their limits.

Then there is the nuclear argument, the central justification repeatedly invoked to legitimise confrontation with Iran. Iran does not possess nuclear weapons. This is not a partisan claim but the widely accepted assessment of international

monitoring bodies and intelligence agencies. Iran maintains a nuclear program and has enriched uranium, but there is no verified evidence that it has assembled or deployed a nuclear weapon.

The narrative of an imminent nuclear threat sounds eerily familiar. The world heard a similar argument in 2003, when the invasion of Iraq was justified by claims of weapons of mass destruction that never existed. The consequences of that war are still unfolding today.

Meanwhile, the humanitarian and economic implications of the current escalation are already visible. Missile exchanges have struck across the Gulf. Insurance premiums for shipping are rising sharply. Global energy markets are on edge as tensions threaten the stability of the corridor through which a significant share of the world's oil supply flows, the (Strait of Hormuz).

War advocates speak confidently about decisive endings. History suggests something very different, prolonged conflicts, fractured states and consequences that outlive the leaders who started them.

None of this absolves Tehran of responsibility

for its own actions. Iran's repression at home and its regional proxy networks remain deeply controversial. But acknowledging those realities does not justify reckless escalation or historical amnesia.

The lesson of 1953 was not that intervention guarantees compliance. It was that it breeds resentment that can last generations. The lesson of Iraq was not that force creates democracy. It was that dismantling a state without a viable successor invites chaos. The lesson of Afghanistan was not that military superiority ensures victory. It was that political legitimacy cannot be manufactured through bombardment.

The Middle East now stands on the edge of a confrontation whose ripple effects will extend far beyond the region. Energy markets, migration patterns, global supply chains and great-power rivalries are all implicated.

War planners often speak with confidence about how conflicts will end. History, however, tells a harsher story. Wars are far easier to start than they are to control. The tragedy of the current crisis is not that the warning signs were invisible. It is that they were ignored.

Behind the bright smiles of UNIMAID: Not everyone smiling is happy

Walking through the gates of the University of Maiduguri (UNIMAID), the first thing that hits you is not just the heat of the Borno sun, it's the vibrant energy from the enthusiastic student of UNIMAID. Along the "Walkway", groups of students walk together, lighting up their day with bright smiles. On the surface, it's a picture of youthful resilience, vibrant hijabs fluttering, students sharing a single bottle of chilled water, and jokes being cracked in a mix of Kanuri, Hausa, and English.

But in the city of "Home of Peace", peace is often a quiet mask. At UNIMAID, a smile isn't always a sign of happiness or joy. Sometimes, it's a survival tactic for the students.

For the average student in Maiduguri, life comes with three major pressures: difficult academic work, a tough and unstable economy, and the continued effects of insecurity in the state.

The school calendar does not wait for anyone. Students face real struggles, they try to keep up with difficult courses while also dealing with the truth that their degree may be their only chance to escape poverty.

"Sapa", the Nigerian slang for extreme financial hardship, is a permanent resident on campus. With the rising cost of fuel and food, the allowance that once lasted a month now barely survives weeks.

Many students (approximately 75%) have mastered the art of skipping meals. A heavy breakfast, no lunch, and a light dinner or no breakfast, a heavy lunch, and no dinner (or vice versa) is the standard operating procedure. But even with all these challenges, students still try their best not to allow their current condition to affect their academics; they smile like nothing really bothers them.

For those living off-campus, in places like

Shagari Low-cost Housing Estate or Post Office, the hike in Keke Napep (tricycle) fares means choosing between attending a 7:00am lecture or having enough money for a loaf of bread.

Yet, when you see these same students in the cafeteria and around the campus, they are smiling. They are "vibing". They are telling stories. To the outsider, they are fine. To their peers, they are just "holding it down".

Why the smile? In the cultural fabric of Northern Nigeria and the tight-knit community of UNIMAID, there is a certain dignity in silence.

"You don't carry your hunger on your face", says Emmanuel, a 400-level student of political science. "If I tell everyone I'm suffering, they won't be able to pay my bills. So, I laugh with my friends, we study together, and we hope for a better tomorrow. The smile is my armour".

The students of UNIMAID are undeniably some of the toughest in the country. They have studied through insurgency and now through economic droughts. Their smiles are a testament to the human spirit's ability to find light in the dust of the Sahel.

However, we must remember that resilience should not be an excuse for neglect. Behind the "Fine, thank you" and the shared jokes at the gate, there is a student wondering where their next meal will come from or how they will buy their handouts and project materials.

The next time you walk past a laughing group of students near Kanem FM station (UNIMAID radio station), look a little closer. The smile is there, yes - but so is the fatigue, and the quiet prayer for a break. In the University of Maiduguri, happiness is a luxury, but the smile is a choice.

Mother of 5 delivers quadruplets in Ogun, appeals for support

A 40-year-old mother of five, Mufiat Olateju, Thursday, delivered to a set of quadruplets at the Federal Medical Centre (FMC), in Abeokuta, the Ogun state capital.

While speaking with newsmen, Mufiat appealed to the state government and well-meaning individuals to support her family in caring for the newborn babies.

She stated that the birth of the quadruplets came as a surprise to the family, as earlier medical scans did not reveal that she was carrying four babies.

"I have given birth to five children before. Initially, when we had a scan, it did not show quadruplets, so we did not prepare for it. According to the first scan, we were expecting just one baby, but subsequent scans showed two.

"Please, I need the help of the government and good people because I do not know where to start. I am 40-year-old, and I want government to help take care of these four children," she said.

Meanwhile, the Consultant Gynecologist, Dr. Taofeek Ogunfunmilayo, who monitored the delivery, noted that the babies were delivered at 32 weeks, noting

that both the mother and the babies require assistance due to the challenges surrounding the unexpected multiple birth.

Ogunfunmilayo added that the woman was not registered at the hospital for ante natal care and was only referred to the facility while already in labour.

He stated that medical personnel initially believed the

woman was carrying triplets, but during surgery, four babies were successfully delivered.

He noted that the mother is currently in stable condition and responding well after the delivery.

"The patient is what we call an 'unbooked' patient. She did not register with us for antenatal care and was only referred to us when she was already in labour. Initially,

we thought she was carrying three babies, but during surgery we were able to deliver four.

"The mother is stable and there is nothing wrong with her. However, because the babies were delivered at 32 weeks, they are premature and have been admitted to the nursery unit where they are receiving specialised care," Ogunfunmilayo said.

Group commends Tinubu's administration on pipeline protection

A group under the platform of South South Initiative, Thursday, commended President Bola Ahmed Tinubu's administration on pipeline protection.

President and convener of the group, Comrade Emmanuel Iriogbe, while speaking with journalists during a press conference in Abuja said, "Nigeria's crude oil infrastructure is not just an asset: it is a lifeline of our national economy."

He noted that for decades, Nigeria suffered enormous losses as a result of pipeline vandalism, illegal bunkering, oil theft and organised criminality across the Niger Delta as trillions of dollars that should have funded development, education,

healthcare and infrastructure were lost to sabotage and systemic corruption.

Iriogbe added that a turning point came when the federal government, beginning from the era of President Goodluck Jonathan and continued by successive administration adopted a community driven security approach by engaging indigenous pipeline surveillance companies with deep knowledge of the terrain and the community.

He added that before the introduction of these indigenous surveillance structures, Nigeria's pipeline were under relentless attack as illegal refineries operated openly and crude was siphoned in massive quantities.

He said the nation could not even determine the exact volume of oil

being produced or stolen.

He also observed that today, the story is different, as pipeline vandalism has reduced drastically and illegal bunkering activities have been significantly curtailed.

He pointed out that the federal government can now make projections and budgetary plans based on more reliable production data.

"These achievement did not happen by accident, they happened because local stakeholders were incorporated into the security architecture as communities that host these pipelines now participate directly in protecting them and youth across the Niger Delta are engaged in legitimate economic activities rather than criminal network," he said.

Benue: Alia calls for collaboration with NCDC to tackle insecurity

The governor of Benue state, Rev. Fr. Hyacinth Iormem Alia, Wednesday, urged the North-Central Development Commission (NCDC) to work closely with his administration in tackling insecurity and advancing development across the state.

Speaking at the Old Banquet Hall, Government House, Makurdi, while hosting the commission's board and management, led by Cosmos Akighir and Dr. Cyril Tseenyil, Governor Alia stated that his government's foremost priority is restoring peace and resettling displaced persons.

"We have done a lot to ensure peace in the state. We have drastically reduced the number of local governments gravely infested by insecurity. Already, there is relative peace in other larger parts of the state.

"But security is like a monster, cut the tail and another part of the body will spring up," he remarked.

The governor added that the ultimate goal is to return displaced communities to their ancestral homes, noting that Benue people "deserve peace to continue to feed the nation."

Beyond security, Governor Alia highlighted agriculture, employment, and rural infrastructure as key areas requiring joint effort.

Bandits attack Katsina village, kill 3, injure 11

Bandits attacked Jikamshi village in Musawa local government area of Katsina state Wednesday evening, leaving three dead as 11 persons sustained injuries.

The attack began shortly before the villagers broke their Ramadan fast and continued until shortly after the meal.

Residents said the attackers stormed the community, shooting sporadically and forcing villagers to flee for safety.

A community leader in the area said the gunmen operated in the village for more than an hour before security forces eventually arrived.

"They came shortly before people broke their fast and stayed for about an hour and some minutes, moving through the streets and shooting," the community leader said.

The source, who requested anonymity because he was not authorised to speak publicly on security matters, described the attack as shocking, adding that residents were caught off guard.

However, a short video reportedly recorded by a resident during the attack has been circulating on social media. Following the incident, local authorities convened an emergency security meeting to discuss measures to prevent further attacks in the area.

The community leader said the chairman of the local government council cancelled an official engagement outside the area and returned to coordinate the response.

"He ensured that all the injured victims received treatment, including those referred to hospitals in Katsina," the source said. (Premium Times)

M/East crisis: ADC calls for protection of citizens against impacts of fuel hikes

The African Democratic Congress (ADC) has called on the federal government to introduce a temporary cap on petrol prices to prevent further increases capable of worsening the cost-of-living crisis in the country.

In a statement signed by its national publicity secretary, Mallam Bolaji Abdullahi, and made available to newsmen in Abuja Thursday, the party said while global oil market volatility linked to the crisis in the Middle East may be contributing to the latest price hikes, the government must act to protect citizens from the impact.

The ADC also urged the introduction of targeted palliatives for low-income Nigerians and criticised the federal government's plan to distribute 100,000 CNG conversion kits, noting that the figure represents less than one percent of Nigeria's over 11 million vehicles and questioning the limited availability of CNG refueling stations across the country.

The statement reads: "The African Democratic Congress (ADC) calls on the Federal Government to immediately introduce a temporary and time-bound cap on petrol prices to prevent further increases that continue to push the cost of living beyond the reach of millions of Nigerians.

Recent hikes in petrol prices reflect rising volatility in global oil markets, driven in part by the ongoing crisis in the Middle East. However, the African Democratic Congress believes that external shocks cannot justify allowing fuel prices to spiral without restraint in an already fragile economy.

"For everyday Nigerians, petrol determines the price of food, transportation, and survival. When petrol rises, everything else rises with it. This is why the African Democratic Congress urges the Federal Government to take urgent action to stabilize petrol prices. For once, the APC-led federal government should try to be responsible by taking responsibility for protecting citizens from the harshest consequences of the ongoing fuel price hikes.

"We also call on the government to introduce targeted palliatives, particularly for low-income Nigerians who are most-affected by the impact of rising fuel prices.

"The government must look beyond temporary solutions to real, scalable answers to Nigeria's energy challenges. How to guard against car thefts, car-snatching – CP Giwa

The Commissioner of Police, Enugu State Police Command, CP Maman Bitrus Giwa, Thursday, said the best and effective way to check car thefts is for car owners to lock their vehicles with pedal locks.

Giwa said using electric device to check car theft is not effective because among car thieves and car snatchers are electricians who can dislodge the vehicles with their devices and instruments.

He posited that with pedals locks, it will be difficult for thieves to steal cars because in the process to cut the locks, they could be heard and caught and they wouldn't want anything that will attract

attention to them.

"They best way to guard against car thefts is for the vehicles owners to lock their cars with pedal locks. With pedal locks, it will be difficult for them to steal vehicles.

"Most of the stolen vehicles are the ones that didn't have pedal locks," he said, pointing out that to install electrical gadgets to check car thefts might not be effective because most car thieves go with electricians who know how to demobilise the electrical devices.

CP Giwa gave the admonition at a press briefing to mark his one year anniversary since he came to the Enugu state command as commissioner.

He said that they recorded successes in the period under review adding

that it was made possible through his proactive policing approach to rid the state of crimes and undesirable elements in the state.

"Recall that upon my assumption of duty exactly one year ago, precisely on 11th March 2025, I pledged to entrench a policing system that is professional, proactive, and people-friendly.

Walida's case adjourned to March 26

The prosecution counsel, Mr. Kabir Adamu, had informed the court that he was ready to proceed with the case, but the defence counsel, Mr. Abdulmalik Sani, requested an extension of time to file a counter affidavit.

However the presiding judge, Justice Hassan Dikko, granted the request and adjourned the case.

The prosecution is seeking the unconditional release and reuniting of Walida with her family, as well as the handover of the suspect to the Commissioner of Police in charge of Jigawa for investigation.

US has 'nothing left to target' in Iran – Trump

The President of the United States, Donald Trump, has said the US war against Iran may soon come to an end, adding that American forces have nearly exhausted their targets inside the country.

Speaking in an interview with Axios, Thursday, Trump said the US military has already struck most of the locations it planned to hit.

"Practically nothing left to target," Trump said the war could end quickly.

"Any time I want it to end, it will end," he stated.

The US president has recently sent mixed signals about the duration of the conflict. Earlier in the week, he also hinted that the

fighting could stop "soon."

Meanwhile, pressure is mounting on Trump at home.

His approval ratings have reportedly fallen, while concerns are rising over the global economic impact of the joint US-Israeli military campaign against Iran.

However, Israel appears less eager to halt the military operation.

Israeli Defense Minister, Israel Katz, said the campaign would continue for as long as necessary.

"This operation will continue without any time limit, as long as necessary, until we achieve all the objectives," Katz said Wednesday.

Iran, on the other hand, has warned that the war could drag

on for an extended period.

Ali Fadavi, an adviser to the commander of Iran's Revolutionary Guards, said the United States and Israel should prepare for a long and damaging conflict.

He said the war could turn into a protracted battle that might weaken both the American military and the global economy.

On Wednesday, Iran's Revolutionary Guards also claimed responsibility for attacks on two commercial ships near the Strait of Hormuz—a Liberia-flagged vessel and a Thai bulk carrier—raising fears that the conflict could further disrupt global shipping and energy supplies. (Reuters)

2027: Don't blackmail opponents, Rep Ogah tells political aspirants in Ebonyi

A member of the House of Representatives, Chinedu Ogah, has urged politicians aspiring for elective offices ahead of the 2027 elections to present themselves to the people rather than resort to blackmail and political attacks.

Ogah, who represents Ikwo/Ezza South federal constituency, made the call while speaking on the outcome of the recent congress of the All Progressives Congress in Ebonyi state.

He described the congress as peaceful and successful, noting that the exercise—from ward to state levels—was conducted without disputes or violence.

According to him, the peaceful outcome reflected the inclusive leadership style of the state governor, Francis Ogbonna Nwifuru, whom he praised for accommodating different political interests in the state.

Ogah said the governor's leadership had strengthened the APC in the state, pointing out that the party's representation in the National Assembly had grown significantly.

"Before now, the APC had only three representatives in the National Assembly from Ebonyi State. Today, we have nine—three senators and six members of the House of Representatives," he said.

The lawmaker urged residents of the state to continue supporting the governor, suggesting that Nwifuru's performance could earn him broad political backing ahead of the next election cycle.

Speaking on the Electoral Act 2026, Ogah explained that candidates must emerge through party primaries voted for by party members, adding that even consensus candidates must receive unanimous agreement from party stakeholders.

He stressed that the law provides equal opportunity for aspirants to contest, advising politicians to focus on grassroots engagement rather than negative campaigns.

"If you want to contest, come out and present yourself before the masses. If the people want you, they will elect you," he said.

Ogah also dismissed claims that amendments to the Electoral Act were designed to favour the APC, insisting that the changes accommodated the interests of different political actors.

non-implementation of full autonomy of the local governments in Nigeria.

The condemnation came due to the delayed implementation of the Supreme Court judgment, slamming the state governments' control of the local governments, especially their stronghold on the federation accounts accruing to them.

Addressing a quarterly press briefing with select media houses, in Enugu,

Chairman of the group, Dr. Emeka Ononamadu, called for direct payment of LGA allocations from the federation account to local governments, which they believed, would improve the local government administration.

In a workshop in Enugu themed, "Local Government Administrative, Political and Fiscal Autonomy in Nigeria: A Recipe for Economic Recovery," CCIDESOR called for

the amendment of the constitution to remove ambiguities around the Joint Account System, as well as strengthening local government accountability mechanisms.

Other calls by the group included transparency in budgeting, procurement and citizen oversight, and guaranteed democratic elections for local governments across all states.

The group said, "Nigeria cannot

achieve meaningful economic recovery without empowering its local government," they posited.

They also pointed out that the non-implementation of the full government autonomy had given the state governments overbearing influence on the local government administration and brought about lack of performance by the local governments in areas of road construction, schools and hospitals.

Court threatens to revoke Sowore's bail over absence in court

A Federal High Court in Abuja has warned that the bail granted to activist and publisher Omoyele Sowore could be revoked if he fails to appear at the next hearing in his ongoing trial over alleged defamatory comments against Bola Ahmed Tinubu.

The warning was issued on Thursday by Justice Mohammed Umar after Sowore and members of his legal team were absent when the case was called.

Sowore, the convener of #RevolutionNow and publisher of Sahara Reporters, is being prosecuted by the Department of State Services (DSS) over claims that he referred to President Tinubu as "a criminal" in posts shared on his social media accounts, including X and Facebook.

During the proceedings, counsel to the DSS, Akinlolu Kehinde (SAN), informed the court that the matter was scheduled for the defence to conclude cross-examination of the first prosecution witness. He told the court that the defendant had been duly served with a hearing notice through his lawyers but failed to appear.

Kehinde noted that no explanation had been provided either by Sowore or any member of his legal team for their absence, despite the defence reportedly having about 30 lawyers.

Citing Section 352(1) and (2) of the Administration of Criminal Justice Act 2015, the prosecution urged the court to revoke Sowore's bail and issue a bench warrant to compel his appearance.

However, Justice Umar declined the request for now, noting that the defendant had consistently attended

previous hearings since the trial began late last year. The judge said the court would give Sowore the benefit of the doubt since it was his first absence.

He warned, however, that if the defendant fails to appear at the next hearing, the court would not hesitate

to revoke his bail and issue an arrest warrant.

The court subsequently adjourned the case until March 16 for continuation of the trial and ordered that another hearing notice be served on the defence.

They alleged there was unpaid largesse, diversion of funds and perceived slighting by the Rivers state Ministry of Agriculture.

The stakeholders described the protest as an attempt to create tension around the program and sabotage its original objectives, adding that Rivers state is in dire need of development in every critical sector.

They stated that the Ministry of Agriculture and its partners should be given the benefit of the doubt to implement the project to its logical conclusion without being hauled with accusations.

Some pundits who commented on the recent development decried the fact that many people still hold on to the notion that incentives billed to create sustainable impact through skills based programs, should be given out as largesse, without adroit supervision of its utility function. They noted that the practice has created a culture of economic doldrum, dependency and servitude in the past.

On his part, the former Commissioner for Agriculture, Victor Kii, who was at the fore of driving the program has in a press statement debunked the allegations and sued for calm, restraint and understanding.

Kii assured the participants that the empowerment phase will be implemented as soon as administrative normalcy is restored.

He commended the participants for their commitment and discipline during the training and urged them to uphold the norms of the program rather than misrepresenting its intentions

Bird Flu: FAO approves \$350,000 emergency support for Nigeria

The Food and Agriculture Organisation of the United Nations (FAO) Thursday approved an emergency technical cooperation programme worth \$350,000 to support Nigeria's response to the ongoing outbreak of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI), commonly known as bird flu.

The support was announced during a strategic meeting held in Abuja between the Minister of Livestock Development, Idi Mukhtar Maiha, and the FAO Representative to Nigeria and ECOWAS, Hussein Gadain, alongside senior officials of the ministry and FAO.

FAO said the intervention will assist Nigeria in containing the disease in

11 affected states, while strengthening surveillance, coordination, and emergency response mechanisms to prevent further spread.

Maiha described effective disease control as critical to improving livestock productivity and protecting farmers' livelihoods across the country.

He noted that several factors, including drought, feed shortages, interaction between wildlife and livestock, as well as cross-border animal movement, have contributed to the spread of livestock diseases in parts of the country.

"We must continue to strengthen our animal health systems and build the capacity required to respond effectively to disease outbreaks. Our collaboration with FAO will help protect livestock

assets, improve productivity, and support the broader transformation of the sector," the minister said.

Gadain, in his remarks, commended the federal government's commitment to developing the livestock sector and reiterated FAO's readiness to provide technical assistance.

He stated the need to strengthen veterinary services at state and community levels, improve early detection of animal diseases, and promote biosecurity practices among livestock farmers.

The meeting also reviewed progress in the global campaign to eradicate Peste des Petits Ruminants (PPR), a highly contagious disease affecting sheep and goats.

To advance the effort, the ministry

plans to convene a national technical meeting involving veterinary institutions, researchers and practitioners to review Nigeria's PPR eradication strategy and address gaps in vaccine supply.

As part of the process, the ministry will engage the National Veterinary Research Institute (NVRI) to assess its vaccine production capacity while exploring other options to meet national demand.

Both parties also agreed to accelerate Nigeria's access to financing under the Pandemic Fund through the One Health approach in collaboration with the Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) and the Federal Ministry of Health to strengthen preparedness against zoonotic diseases.

Senate mourns fallen military personnel in Kukawa attack

The Senate, Thursday, mourned fallen soldiers in Kukawa attack in Borno and expressed grave concern over the deadly assault on a Nigerian Army formation.

It observed a minute silence for the soldiers following a motion moved by Senator Mohammed Tahir Monguno (APC Borno North).

Moving the motion, Monguno said the suspected insurgents launched the coordinated attack in the early hours of March 9, targeting troops stationed in Kukawa local government area.

He said the attackers advanced from several directions, engaging soldiers in a prolonged battle that lasted nearly 24 hours, but the troops resisted bravely.

Monguno lamented the death of Lt. Col. Umar Farouq, describing him as a key figure who restored stability to Kukawa after insurgents once ransacked the town.

"Lt.-Col Farouq played a pivotal role in facilitating the return of displaced

residents," Monguno noted.

The lawmaker also stated that several military vehicles were destroyed and weapons looted during the assault, describing the attack as part of renewed insurgent offensives.

He said the attack came despite ongoing counter-insurgency operations

under Operation Hadin Kai aimed at dismantling extremist networks in the Northeast.

He further stated that another community, Doro in Kukawa local government area, was attacked by insurgents Wednesday morning, resulting in the death of one soldier.

"Even this morning, as I came to present this motion, I received reports of another attack," he lamented.

He commended the courage and sacrifice of officers and soldiers defending Nigeria's territorial integrity and protecting communities from insurgent violence.

NSDC faces Reps' panel over sugar import data, revenue remittances

The House of Representatives Committee on Finance has raised concerns over discrepancies in the reported volume of sugar imported into Nigeria, and the revenue accruing to the National Sugar Development Council (NSDC).

Chairman of the committee, Hon. James Faleke, expressed the concerns of the committee during the ongoing

revenue monitoring exercise covering the 2023–2025 fiscal years.

Faleke questioned the accuracy of the council's data on sugar imports, saying that the figures presented by the agency might not accurately reflect the actual volume of sugar entering the country.

Executive secretary of the NSDC, Mr. Kamar Bakrin, in responding, stated that the NSDC does not directly collect revenue from sugar imports, adding that the Nigeria

Customs Service collects sugar levies at the ports, and remits same into appropriate government accounts.

He also clarified that the council's role in the importation process is largely regulatory and advisory.

Bakrin said companies seeking to import raw sugar must obtain import licences, which are issued following recommendations by the council based on the performance and compliance level of operators and processors in the sector.

Court arraigns man for allegedly defrauding firm of N21mn in land deal

The Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) has arraigned one Olawore Kazeem Ademola, before a Special Offences Court sitting in Ikeja, Lagos, over an alleged N21 million land fraud.

Ademola was arraigned before Justice Mojisola on a two-count charge bordering on obtaining money by false pretence and stealing.

The anti-graft agency said the defendant allegedly obtained N21,000,000 from Lincoln City Services and Investments Limited in October 2021 under the pretext that he had 15 acres of land for sale at Igboku Village in Ilara Town, Epe local government area of Lagos state.

The EFCC stated that the money was paid as part of the purchase price for the land, a claim it alleges the defendant knew to be false.

Naira adds more weight as foreign reserves top \$50bn

The naira gained sharply at the official window as foreign reserves topped the \$50 billion mark for the first time since January 2009, according to updated Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) data.

At the official window, the CBN's daily foreign exchange (forex) data publication showed that the spot rate appreciated by about two per cent on Wednesday to N1376.1925 per dollar, from N1401 the previous day.

Reflecting improved forex liquidity in the official window, foreign transactions were conducted at an intraday low of N1373 and a high of N1388 per dollar.

In the parallel market, the naira also climbed to N1,393/\$, reflecting improved currency sentiment across both the regulated official segment and the informal foreign exchange market.

Meanwhile, Nigeria's gross external reserves topped \$50 billion, according to a CBN publication, the highest level seen since 2009.

At the global forex market, the US dollar is mixed in the North American

Hormuz shipping disruptions raise risks for energy, economies – UNCTAD

UN Trade and Development (UNCTAD) have said the Strait of Hormuz disruptions are taking its toll on the global energy markets.

Before the conflict/strike escalation, Brent crude (the global benchmark) was priced at around \$73. Prices began jumping immediately after the initial U.S./Israeli strikes on Iran, with Brent briefly hitting \$82+ and then surging higher amid retaliations, supply fears, and regional disruptions—eventually exceeding \$100 (and peaking near \$120 in early March 2026) before volatile pullbacks. As of today (March 12, 2026), Brent crude oil stood at \$101 per barrel.

In a report titled: "Strait of Hormuz disruptions: Implications for global trade and development", The UN agency noted that military escalation in the region has disrupted shipping flows through this narrow passage, raising concerns about ripple effects across energy markets, maritime transport and global supply chains.

The Strait carries around one quarter of global seaborne oil trade, as well as significant volumes of liquefied natural gas and fertilizers.

According to UNCTAD, in the report, "Freight rates for oil tankers and war risk insurance premiums are surging, while marine fuel costs are also rising, increasing shipping costs across supply chains.

"Around one third of global seaborne fertilizer trade (about 16m tonnes) passes through the Strait, raising concerns about fertilizer access for some of the poorest countries.

"Developing economies may be particularly exposed, as high debt burdens and rising borrowing costs limit their ability to absorb new price shocks.

The UN body said past crises – including COVID-19 and the war in Ukraine – showed how disruptions to energy, transport and agricultural inputs can quickly spread across interconnected markets.

The Japanese yen is the weakest of the G10 currencies as the dollar extended Wednesday's gains to almost JPY158.50, its best level since the Fed/Treasury reportedly checked rates on January 23. The PBOC set the dollar's fix to a new multi-year low Thursday.

NRS didn't close our office, OPay clarifies

OPay Digital Services Limited has dismissed online platforms and social media reports claiming that its Lagos and Abuja were sealed by the Nigeria Revenue Service (NRS) over alleged non-compliance with Value Added Tax (VAT) and Company Income Tax under the Nigeria Tax Act 2025.

In a statement issued by its management, the digital payment platform described the reports as incorrect and misleading.

According to OPay, its offices across Nigeria, including Lagos and Abuja, remained open and fully operational saying that it would continue to serve its customers, partners, and merchants without disruption.

"As a responsible financial technology company operating in Nigeria, we are compliant with all applicable tax obligations and regulatory requirements. We work closely and transparently with all relevant government agencies and regulatory authorities to ensure that our operations consistently meet statutory standards.

"The notice referenced in the reports arose from a recent industry-wide directive by the NRS requesting payment platforms to distinctly separate certain statutory charges on their applications for easier reconciliation and transparency.

"This administrative clarification affects multiple operators across the industry, not OPay alone. The suggestion that the notice indicates non-payment of taxes is therefore factually incorrect and misleading.

Domestic equities return to bullish run, gain N648bn

The local equities market on Thursday took positive direction, appreciating by N648 billion as gains in MTN Nigeria lifted trading during the day.

Market capitalisation of listed equities rose by 0.51 per cent to N126.398 trillion from N125.750 trillion reported the previous day.

The NGX All Share Index grew by 1,010.23 basis points to 196908.76 from 195898.53 points reported on Wednesday, bringing year to date return to 26.54 per cent.

The market rally was driven by gains in the shares of MTN Nigeria, Zenith Bank GTCO Plc, NGX group, Fidson health care and among others.

Volume of trades 121.492 million, representing 18.09 per cent as investors traded 549.781 million against 671.263 million recorded the previous day. Value of transactions increased by 71.20 per cent to settle at N44.735 billion in 55465 deals.

An analysis of the investment showed that FTGInsurance led gainers table, appreciating by 10 per cent to close at N6.27 per unit, Fidson healthcare followed with a gain of 9.97 per cent to close at N105.35 per unit, DeapCapital added 8.89 per cent to close at N7.00 per unit, Caverton Business Solutions increased by 9.40 per cent to close at N6.40 per share, Livestock Feeds gained 9.30 per cent to close at N7.05 per unit.

On the contrary, Eterna Plc and Omatek topped losers chart, dropping by 10 per cent each to close at N42.30 and N2.52 per unit respectively, Scoa trailed with a loss of 9.94 per cent to close at N22.65 per unit, FTGInsurance down by 9.24 per cent to close at N1.08 per share, Sovereign Trust Insurance dipped by 9.09 per cent to close at N2.10 per share.

Trading in the shares of FTGInsurance led market activities with 32.182 million shares valued at N34.775 million, Access Holdings Company followed with account of 28.124 million shares worth N700.985 million, FirstHoldco traded 27.722 million shares cost N1.385 billion, Zenith Bank sold a total of 27.483 million cost N2.558 billion, Dangote Cement exchanged 26.892 million shares cost N20.670 billion, Sterling Bank traded 24.608 million shares valued at N184.926 million.

"Equally troubling is the selective and deliberate singling out of OPay in a matter that concerns the wider industry. Brent inches past \$100 over fresh oil tankers attack

Oil prices surged on Thursday, with Brent crude inching past \$100 a barrel following reports of an attack on two oil tankers near Iraq's Basra port, raising concerns about potential supply disruptions in the Middle East.

Data from the commodity market shows that Brent crude was trading at \$97.74 per barrel, up 6.6% from the previous close of \$91.68.

Similarly, the US benchmark West Texas Intermediate (WTI) climbed 6.5% to \$93.07 per barrel, up from \$87.41 in the previous session.

The price spike occurred after reports

surfaced of two international oil tankers being attacked in the northern Gulf, near the borders of Iraq and Kuwait, temporarily pushing futures above \$100 per barrel.

This price increase came despite a coordinated decision by the 32-member countries of the International Energy Agency (IEA) to release approximately 400 million barrels from strategic oil reserves, the largest such release in the agency's history.

Furthermore, the US Department of Energy announced that it would release 172 million barrels of oil from the Strategic Petroleum Reserve (SPR) over the next 120 days.

The department also stated that the

reserve is expected to be replenished within the next year with about 200 million barrels—approximately 20% more than the withdrawn volume—without imposing additional costs on taxpayers.

Although the additional supply might ease global supply concerns and potentially limit further price increases, reports of tanker attacks near Iraq's Basra port have reignited fears of supply disruptions.

An official confirmed that at least one person was killed in the attack, which targeted the two oil tankers in Iraqi territorial waters. Lt. Gen. Saad Maan of the Security Media Cell, speaking to Al-Iraqiya News, labelled the incident a "cowardly act of sabotage."

NB partners Indorama, Genesis to develop production plant in Ogun

Nigerian Breweries has announced plans to establish a food-grade recycled polyethylene terephthalate (rPET) production facility in Ogun State as part of a strategic partnership

aimed at strengthening sustainable packaging and supporting Nigeria's growing recycling industry.

The company disclosed the development in a notice to the Nigerian Exchange Limited (NGX) and the investing public, stating that the project will be developed in collaboration with global recycler Indorama Ventures Public Company Limited and energy infrastructure firm Genesis Energy Group.

Under the arrangement, Nigerian Breweries will hold a 29 percent minority stake in the venture, which will be managed through a special purpose vehicle, Indorama Ventures Recycling Solutions Limited.

Indorama Ventures, the majority partner, will lead the funding, development, and operation of the facility, while the plant will supply food-grade rPET to Nigerian Breweries and other manufacturing companies in line with Nigeria's plastic waste management policy.

The brewery said it will remain a minority investor in the partnership and will not participate in the control or management of the business.

According to the company, the investment is part of its broader sustainability strategy and will ensure access to recycled packaging materials in the future.

"The partnership secures a reliable future supply of rPET for Nigerian Breweries operations, in line with the

roadmap for mandatory usage under national policy," the company stated.

Food-grade recycled polyethylene terephthalate is a recycled plastic material widely used for beverage packaging. Produced from purified terephthalic acid and ethylene glycol, the thermoplastic polymer has strong molecular chains that provide durability, transparency, and resistance to water and chemicals.

These properties make rPET suitable for food and beverage packaging, as the material does not leach into liquids stored inside it.

The move comes as the Federal Government intensifies enforcement of plastic waste regulations under the Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) framework.

Industry analysts say Nigerian Breweries' move reflects the growing regulatory and market push toward circular economy practices in Nigeria's manufacturing sector.

Environmental policy analyst Chinwe Okoli said investments in recycling infrastructure will become increasingly important as the government enforces EPR rules.

"With mandatory plastic recovery policies now in place, companies that rely heavily on plastic packaging must secure reliable recycling streams. Establishing local rPET production will help reduce dependence on imported recycled materials," she said.

Power crisis looms as gas suppliers threatens cut over N3.3trn debt

Nigeria's electricity supply may deteriorate further as power generation companies warn that gas suppliers could halt supply due to mounting debts within the country's power sector.

The alarm was raised by the Chief Executive Officer of the Association of Power Generation Companies (APGC), Joy Ogaji, who said gas suppliers have issued warnings that they may stop delivering gas to power plants unless outstanding payments are settled.

Speaking during an interview on Fresh FM, Ogaji said the persistent power outages experienced by Nigerians over the past several months are largely linked to the huge debt owed to gas suppliers.

According to her, Nigeria's electricity generation capacity has been severely constrained due to limited gas availability, with thermal power plants—largely dependent on gas—struggling to operate at optimal capacity.

Ogaji explained that the Federal Government's debt to power generation companies has continued to grow, placing the entire electricity value chain under significant financial pressure.

"Gas is not available because the gas suppliers have told us that if we need gas, we need to put money on the ground to get gas in the pipe. We owe them a lot of money," she said.

Providing a breakdown of the liabilities, she noted that the sector's debt profile rose sharply over the years.

"From 2015 to December 2024, the debt profile grew to N4 trillion. In each month of 2025, there was a shortfall of N200 billion. If you multiply that by 12 months, it adds N2.4 trillion, bringing the total to about N6.4 trillion by the end of 2025.

"We are already in March 2026. The debt rose to N6.6 trillion in January and N6.8 trillion in February."

She added that the worsening debt situation is directly responsible for the prolonged electricity shortages being experienced across the country.

"Yes, it is 120 percent correct to say that the debt is the reason why we are in darkness," Ogaji said.

Reacting to the development, the Minister of Power, Adebayo Adedun, said the issue is currently being addressed by the Federal Government.

Adedun, who is also reportedly preparing to contest the governorship election in Oyo State, spoke through his spokesperson, Bolaji Tunji.

Tunji said the matter is being handled jointly with the Minister of State for Petroleum (Gas), Ekperikpe Ekpo.

"It is being handled jointly with the Minister of State for Petroleum (Gas)," Tunji said in a brief statement.

However, despite assurances from the government, many Nigerians say there has been little improvement in electricity supply.

Energy analysts say the crisis highlights deeper structural problems within the Nigerian Electricity Supply Industry.

Power sector analyst Ayodele Oni said the growing debt burden across the electricity value chain is threatening the stability of the entire industry.

"When generation companies cannot pay gas suppliers, the supply chain breaks down. Gas producers will naturally prioritise customers that can pay. That is why we are seeing persistent generation shortages," Oni explained.

Similarly, energy economist Muda Yusuf said Nigeria's electricity market remains trapped in a liquidity crisis that requires urgent government intervention.

FIBA W/Cup qualifiers: Nigeria bow to S/Korea in Lyon

Nigeria's D'Tigress suffered their first defeat at the FIBA Women's World Cup Qualifying Tournament in Lyon after losing 77-60 to South Korea on Thursday.

The loss came less than 24 hours after the Nigerian side delivered a commanding 70-37 victory over Colombia in their opening game of the tournament.

Korea started taking the 1st quarter 20-16; drew the 2nd quarter 16-16 ending the half time scores at 36-32. On the resumption of the 3rd quarter, Nigeria lost 19-22 and was seized by fatigue as the 4th quarter ended a whopping 19-9 in favor of Korea.

Nigeria knew it would be tough as they met for the 3rd time having taken victory twice by whiskers at the Olympics, winning 68-64 in 2004 and also winning 70-69 in 2016.

Coach Rena Wakama of Nigeria sat staring into space thinking what hit her players as she made several changes to survive in her 18th game in charge winning 14 and now conceding her 5th loss.

Korea had lost to Germany 49-76 in the 1st game and needed a win over Nigeria to have hope as Nigeria also earlier drubbed

Columbia 70-37 in their 1st game.

Korea was better off with points off turnovers 33-14; had 15-8 points from fast breaks but Nigeria had 12-5 points from second chances as well as 26-20 points on the paints.

The Koreans are regarded as the most successful team from Asia with 12 Asian titles; having been

ranked 15th in the world, they have made 17 appearances at FIBA World Cup, winning silver twice in 1967 and 1979.

They have been at the Olympics seven times, winning silver in 1984.

On the other hand, Nigeria

has earned seven Afrobasket titles with five consecutive wins till 2025. D'Tigress are on their 3rd appearances at the World Cup with quarterfinal in 2018 and three appearances at the Olympics with no medal.

Applicant.

Speaking with journalists at the court premises after the adjournment, lead counsel to the Gwagwalada Football Stakeholders, Babatunde Akintade, expressed optimism that the defendant would appear at the next hearing.

Akintade said the stakeholders were not making excessive demands but were only seeking transparency regarding sports infrastructure projects in the Federal Capital Territory.

"We are hopeful that at the next sitting the defendant will be represented. Our clients are not asking for too much; they simply want the relevant information concerning the abandoned stadiums in the Federal Capital Territory," he said.

The case is expected to resume on May 13.

game. Reacting to his performance, the 1998 FIFA World Cup winner said on the Morning Football show with ESPN that Osimhen deserves to be playing in the Premier League.

"I would love to see Osimhen one day in the Premier League or the La Liga,"

"I think, with all due respect to the Turkish Super Lig, I think Osimhen deserves to play in the best league in the world, so the Premier League would be great," the 58-year-old concluded.

Shocker: NIS boss calls for ban on political, religious use of National Stadiums

The Director General and Chief Executive Officer of the National Institute for Sports (NIS), H.E. Comrade Philip Shaibu, has called for the ban of Political and Religious activities at the MKO National Stadium, Abuja and other National Stadiums across the country

Shaibu warned that the continuous use of sports infrastructure for non-sporting activities has contributed significantly to the deterioration of many stadiums across the country.

According to him, these facilities were built for the training, retraining, and development of Nigerian sportsmen and women, and must be preserved for that purpose.

The NIS Boss lamented that the practice has left Nigeria with very few stadiums that meet international standards, noting that the Godswill Akpabio International Stadium in Uyo currently remains the only facility in the country that fully meets FIFA requirements for hosting international matches.

Recalling his experience as Deputy Governor of Edo State, where he supervised sports and the Samuel Ogbemudia Stadium, Shaibu said deliberate efforts were made during his tenure to preserve the facility, particularly the athletics track which was under warranty with the contractor.

However, he explained that the situation changed following disagreements with the former Governor, Godwin Obaseki, which eventually led to the approval of the stadium for singer Rema's homecoming concert.

Shaibu said the event allowed heavy vehicles and equipment onto the pitch and tracks, damaging the facility and breaching the contractor's warranty agreement.

"Today, the Samuel Ogbemudia Stadium can no longer host

international matches unless major remediation works are carried out," he said.

Shaibu therefore urged the National Sports Commission (NSC) and the Nigeria Football Federation (NFF) to collaborate with the National Institute for Sports in its quest to protecting and restoring sports infrastructure across the country.

He also called again for the immediate reconstitution of the board of the National Sports Commission to strengthen management, maintenance, and preservation of sports facilities nationwide.

The NIS DG stressed that protecting sports infrastructure is critical to the future of Nigerian youths, adding that sports remain a major platform for youth empowerment and national unity.

He noted that President Bola Ahmed Tinubu's vision for youth development and sports growth in Nigeria can only be achieved if the country begins to treat its sports facilities as strategic national assets.

According to Shaibu, safeguarding stadiums and investing in sports development will not only help discover and nurture young talents but also restore Nigeria's pride in international competitions.
